Norfolk International Airport reports on September 2019 activity

NORFOLK, Va. – (October 11, 2019) – Norfolk International Airport (ORF) reported a 10.43 percent increase in passenger activity for the month of September 2019 with 306,667 total passengers. This figure compares to a September 2018 passenger count of 277,715. January to September 2019 total passenger count has increased 11 percent representing 2,984,958 passengers versus 2,689,067 passengers during the same period in 2018. The third quarter total passenger count of 1,099,787 is the highest in the Airport's history.

In other activity, 4,760,624 pounds of cargo were shipped in and out of the airport during September 2019. This represents a 8.08 percent decrease versus September 2018, which saw 5,179,217 pounds of cargo shipped. January to September 2019 cargo pounds shipped have decreased 0.42 percent representing 47,674,682 cargo pounds versus 47,873,640 cargo pounds during the same period in 2018.

The above-mentioned figures are a reflection of the service by scheduled airlines Allegiant, American, Delta, Frontier, Southwest, United and their regional airline partners and charter airlines Miami Air, Sun Country, Swift Air and XTRAirways. Cargo carriers include Federal Express, Mountain Air Cargo and UPS.

Norfolk International Airport (ORF) is the major airport serving Coastal Virginia and Northeast North Carolina with scheduled air service provided by Allegiant, American, Delta, Frontier, Southwest, United and their affiliate airline partners. Together they provide nonstop access to 31 major airports (includes year-round and seasonal service), most of which are international gateways, allowing convenient access to global destinations. According to the FAA, Norfolk International Airport's passenger activity is ranked in the top 13% of commercial service airports in the United States with over 3.6 million scheduled passengers served in 2018.
